GENERAL NEWS

- EWN (702) reported that the two South African crew members have tested negative and can return home. South Africans wanting to be repatriated from Wuhan has increased to 184.
- The BBC reported that the Italian government will close all schools and universities in the country until mid-March. All professional sports, including Serie A football matches, will be played behind closed doors for a month. The tourism sector is predicted to lose BPS6,5 bn (USD8,5 bn). (https://bbc.in/2uVQc3J)
- Saudi Arabia has banned locals from travelling to the holy cities of Mecca and Madinah

GLOBAL TOURISM UPDATES

- ITB India 2020, originally scheduled from 15 to 17 April 2020 has been postponed. ITB India 2021 will be held 7 9 April 2021 in Mumbai
- RECOMB 2020 scheduled for May 2020 in Italy has been cancelled.
- Virgin Atlantic CE is going to take a 20% pay cut for 4 months and forward bookings down as much as 50% (https://bit.ly/39p8IG9)
- Reuters report that African airlines face USD40 million hit in 2020 due to Corona. The global hit to the aviation industry is projected to be USD29 billion. (https://bit.ly/2TmaAEm)
- The FT reported around the crisis in the aviation industry Airbus is reviewing is 2020 delivery targets, IATA predicts a USD30 billion impact, BA cancelled 400 flights between March 16 and 28 on Monday, Ryanair cut flights to Italy by 25% between March 17 and April 8, etc. (https://on.ft.com/2TJ37hA)
