
There is more good news for interconnectivity on our African continent. In this edition we also feature news about Pro Flight Zambia resuming direct flights between Durban and Lusaka.

Why is Freedom Day important?

The date "27 April" celebrates freedom and commemorates the first democratic elections held on that day in 1994. The elections were the first non-racial national elections where everyone of voting age of over 18 years from any race group, was allowed to vote. Previously, under the apartheid regime, non-white South Africans had only limited rights to vote while black South Africans had no voting rights whatsoever. This day marked the end of minority rule and ushered in the establishment of a new democratic government led by late President Nelson Mandela and a new state subject to a new constitution.

There is no doubt that 27 April 1994 was a turning point in South Africa's history and it remains a day we are proud of.


- Catch a ferry to Robben Island and tour the historic sites.

ProFlight Zambia Resumes Direct Flights Between Durban And Lusaka

Durban Direct is pleased to welcome the resumption of air services between Lusaka, Zambia and Durban, South Africa. The flights started on 6 April 2023 and will operate on Thursdays with Sunday flights being introduced on the 16th of April, and a special Tuesday flight today, 11 April for visitors returning on the Easter weekend.

The launch of these air services provides a significant boost to the volume of travellers between Zambia and South Africa. In 2021 and 2022 travel between the two destinations experienced a 38% growth, while over the same period, South Africa's exports to Zambia grew by R 1,6 billion making Zambia amongst South Africa's key trading partners within Southern Africa.

"As the government of KwaZulu-Natal, we are pleased to welcome these air services flown by ProFlight Zambia. This new air service will undoubtedly play a role in strengthening the business links between the two destinations, especially considering that there are already many companies operating in both Zambia and South Africa. The improved air connectivity will make it easier for businesses to travel between the two countries, facilitating even greater trade and investment," said Mr Siboniso Duma the MEC for Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs and the leader of Government Business in KwaZulu-Natal.

The new route will also provide a much-needed boost to the tourism industry, with Zambia and South Africa both being popular tourist destinations.

The mayor of EThekwini, Cllr. Mxolisi Kaunda expressed his excitement for ProFlight's return. "We are thrilled to have ProFlight flying back to Durban. As the tourism industry is gradually recovering, the resumption of these air services facilitates greater leisure and business travel into Durban. Growing intra-Africa travel is also a key component of our broader strategy to ensure competitiveness, which is further enabled by the addition of this air connectivity."

Mr Nkosinathi Myataza, Regional General Manager of the Airports Company South Africa, concluded "We're pleased to reintroduce direct flights from Lusaka to Durban, it supports our collective efforts to restoring air connectivity into KwaZulu-Natal. The resumption of the air service is a positive development for both Zambia and South Africa, with the potential to boost trade, tourism, and business links between the two destinations."
