



Abdullah Ibrahim and Ndlovu Youth Choir



South Africa continues to shine on the global stage in music: Kabza De Small Kabza De Small announced as Drake's producer for the upcoming 'It's All a Blur Tour'


Canadian superstar rapper, Drake has revealed that South African musician Kabza De Small is a producer on his tour - 'It's All a Blur'.

Reminder: Women in Tourism Survey


While there are many established and successful women in the tourism industry, many are still facing barriers or do not have access to the same resources as more established female business owners or high-level managers.

It is important for those who have successfully climbed the ranks to nurture more top leaders, entrepreneurs and industrialists in the sector.

This was highlighted recently by Minister of Tourism, Patricia de Lille, at a Women in Tourism (WIT) breakfast, noting that the Department of Tourism initiated the WIT programme to drive the inclusion of female entrepreneurs in the industry.

Invitation to enrol for the Artisan Recognition of Prior Learning (ARPL) programme for chefs in the Western Cape and KwaZulu-Natal province

The Department of Tourism hereby invites suitable candidates to enrol for the ARPL for Chefs programme. The programme is targeted at individuals who have been working as Chefs but have no formal qualification.

The programme aims to recognise the prior learning of Chefs in order for them to obtain a formal Chef Occupational Qualification (SAQA ID 101697). Upon successful completion of this programme, graduates will be conferred with a Chef Occupational Certificate which is aligned to National Qualification Framework (NQF) Level 5. Tuition fees and other study materials for the programme will be covered 100% by the Department of Tourism. Candidates will be responsible for their own transport and accommodation if/when the need arise.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- 19 years and older;
- · Must be a South African citizen;
- At least 3 years' industry experience, working as a Chef in a brigaded kitchen;
- Ability to read and write English;
- Your application should indicate which province you are applying for; and
- Candidates must be able to attend sessions at the appointed trade centre in their respective provinces.

APPLICATION MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS

- Motivation letter from the applicant;
- A detailed CV of the applicant;
- Service letter (Proof of former and current work experience)
- · Certified copy of ID;
- Proof of residence; and
- · Certified copies of school qualifications.

The closing date for the submission of applications is the 31st July 2023.

Kamara House, Thornybush


Location: Thornybush Nature Reserve, Limpopo


Upcoming Product: Aha Hotels & Lodges


Location: Sabie River, Mpumlanaga
